

Title: Iran's new scientific community1.

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Abstract: This article explores the emergence of a new scientific community in Iran. In spite of all the major problems in the country, according to the prevailing international norms (the number of scientific articles published in international journals and their increase throughout the years), there is a remarkable progress made in some scientific fields in Iran during the last two decades. The aim of this article is to display the identity problems of this new group and their relationship to the Iranian society and the 'imagined' world scientific community at large.

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Abstract: A scientific community is a group of people who share scientific values, share a degree of corporate identity in terms of material interests, and relate to one another as members of this community. The group distinguishes itself from other groups in the larger society through these characteristics. This definition, as we shall see, leaves much room for interpretation. Membership in this community can be ambiguous, non-recognized, or simply covered up by the individual, and even the existence of such a community can be denied.' Given these possibilities, how do leading scientists in Iran regard the scientific community? Do they believe that it exists, and if so, how do they see its problems?

The article discusses the state of scientific research in Iran after the Islamic Revolution in the 1980s. Generational and subjective problems for scientists; Impact of the initiation of graduate studies programs in **science** and scientific research institutes in the creation of an Iranian scientific community; Operational definition of a scientific community.
